συζητώ

to talk about something with someone, especially when you need to make a decision *I'll telephone you tomorrow, so that we can discuss our plans.* • discussion (n)

1.2 amount (n)

ποσότητα

how much there is of something We only have a small **amount** of sugar, so we'll need to order more.

1.3 take up (phr v)

ξεκινάω κάτι, π.χ. μια δραστηριότητα

to start doing a new activity (e.g. a new hobby) that you will continue to do regularly *I took up* basketball when I was thirteen, and since then I have been playing every week for five years.

1.4 improve (v)

βελτιώνω

to make something better Beth **improved** her marks by studying harder. • improvement (n)

1.5 fitness (n)

φυσική κατάσταση

having a strong, active and healthy body Anthony exercised at the gym every morning to increase his **fitness**.

fit (adj)

1.6 cough: have a cough (phr)

βήχας

to have a problem with your breathing (e.g. when you are ill), so that you keep letting out air with a loud sound

My grandfather smokes a lot of cigarettes, and he **has a cough**. He really should quit. • cough (v)

1.7 sore throat (n)

πονόλαιμος

pain in the throat (i.e. the inside of your neck), due to illness, too much shouting, etc.
Danny woke up with a sore throat and made some tea with honey to help him feel better.
soreness (n)

1.8 temperature: have a (high) temperature (phr) έχω πυρετό

to feel that your body is too hot because of illness

Jackie feels ill and has a high temperature of 39°C.

1.9 ham (n)

ζαμπόν

meat from the upper part of a pig's leg Along with bacon, I also like to put some **ham** on my pizza.

1.10 plain (adj)

απλό

(food) simple and without extra ingredients to change the taste *The shops sell potato chips that taste of bacon,*

pizza, tomato... But I just prefer the **plain** kind.

1.11 presentation (n) παρουσίαση

an event at a work meeting, a school class, etc., where someone shows and explains something (e.g. a project) to a group of people *It helps if you include images in your* **presentation**, as the rest of the class will get bored if they can only listen to you talk for twenty minutes.

presenter (n)

1.12 replace (v) [1] αντικαθιστώ

to change something that is old, damaged, etc., with something new *I can only use my laptop for twenty minutes*

before the power runs out. Maybe I need to **replace** the battery.

replacement (n)

1.13 ink cartridge (n)

δοχείο με μελάνι

the part of a printer that contains the ink The photocopies from the printer were coming out white, so I put in a new **ink cartridge**.

1.14 attend (v)

παρακολουθώ, παρευρίσκομαι

to go to an event (e.g. a class, a meeting, etc.) *I have to go to the doctor's tomorrow, so I won't be able to attend gym class in the morning.*attendance (n)

1.15 sweet and sour (adj)

ξινό

made with a sauce that combines different tastes as it contains both sugar and vinegar or lemon

Whenever we go to a Chinese restaurant, I like to order **sweet and sour** pork, as the taste is quite different from the food in other restaurants.

1.16 especially (adv)

ειδικά

[used to show that a statement is even more true for a specific person or thing] Kim doesn't like winter days, **especially** those which have snow, because she can't drive her car in snowy weather.

1.17 over: be over (phr v) Όταν κάτι έχει τελειώσει

(an event, a period, etc.) to have finished Now that the weekend **is over**, it's time to get back to work.

1.18 celebrate (v) γιορτάζω

to do something special for people to enjoy themselves on an important day You passed your exam! Well done! Let's have a party to **celebrate**. • celebration (n), celebrative (adj)

1.19 shape: to be out of shape (phr)

δεν είμαι πλέον σε καλή φυσική κατάσταση, αγύμναστος

to be less healthy than you used to be, so that you find it more difficult to exercise, run, etc. *Paul hadn't played football for a year, and he* **was** so **out of shape** that he couldn't finish the game.

1.20 basic (adj)

βασικό

very important and necessary The **basic** ingredients for a cake are flour, eggs and sugar.

1.21 fine (adj)

Μια χαρά

[used to show that the writer/speaker doesn't have a problem with something] I'd prefer to meet on Tuesday, but Wednesday is also **fine**.

1.22 physical (adj)

Φυσική,σωματική relating to the body You have to take care of your **physical** health by exercising and eating well, and also look after your emotional health by avoiding stress.

1.23 condition (n)

κατάσταση

the way that someone or something is, e.g. how healthy a person is, at a particular time The DeWight family take good care of their home and keep it in good **condition**, unlike the Smiths, whose house looks ready to fall down.

1.24 wear someone out (phr v)

εξαντλώ κάποιον από την κούραση (e.g. a difficult task) to make someone extremely tired, so that they have no more energy left

Lifting heavy boxes all day completely **wore** us **out**, and we didn't even have enough energy to walk home.

• worn out (adj)

1.25 gentle (adj)

ήπια

(e.g. exercise) not heavy or extreme
You can start with a routine of gentle exercise
then move on to more difficult activities later.
gentleness (n)

1.26 strain (v)

καταπονώ

to put too much force on a part of the body, in a way that causes pain, damage or injury *The effort of trying to read in the dark can strain your eyes.* • strain (n), strained (adj)

1.27 muscle (n)

μυς

a part of the body that causes movement *To run fast uphill, you need good strong muscles in your legs.* • muscular (adj)

1.28 ache (v)

πονάει

to feel slight pain for a long time
After running the marathon, my body was
aching all over and I really needed a massage.
ache (n)

1.29 in case: (just) in case (conj)

στην περίπτωση που

because there is a possibility that something might happen and you need to be prepared *Let's leave half-an-hour earlier,* **just in case** *there is a lot of traffic on the roads.*

1.30 tablet (n)

Ταμπλέτα, δισκίο

medicine in the form of a small, hard object that you swallow

To reduce my symptoms, the doctor said I have to take two **tablets** of this medicine every morning.

1.31 throat (n)

λάρυγγας

the inside of your neck I drank the tea, which was too hot, burning the inside of my mouth and my **throat**.

1.32 selection (of something) (n)

ποικιλία

a number of things (e.g. products) that you can choose from

The store has such a large **selection** of cakes that I'm not sure which one to choose. • select (v)

1.33 success (n)

επιτυχία

something (e.g. an event) that had a positive result

Despite the rain, the outdoor party was a real **success** and everyone enjoyed themselves. • succeed (v)

1.34 glad (adj)

χαρούμενος, ικανοποιημένος

feeling pleased and happy about something I'm so **glad** that I will never have to see that horrible man again.

• gladness (n)

1.35 make the effort (to do something) (phr) προσπαθώ

to do something, even if it is difficult, because you think it is important Even when I'm tired, I always **make the effort** to write in my diary every night.

1.36 miss [1] (v)

χάνω

to not go to a place (e.g. to class) or to an event, usually a place or an event that you should go to or want to go to *I'm not feeling well, so I'm afraid I'll have to miss* the party.

1.37 assignment (n)

άσκηση

a task or job that someone (e.g. a student) has to do for his/her studies or for work For their next homework **assignment**, the students had to write a text of five hundred words about their favorite movie.

assign something (to someone) / (someone) something

1.38 novel (n)

μυθιστόρημα

a book that tells a story

'Great Expectations', by the English writer Charles Dickens, tells the story of a character named Pip, and it is one of the best **novels** I have ever read.

• novelist (n)

1.39 go through (to something) (phr v) περνάω επιτυχώς μια διαδικασία

to pass to the next level, e.g. of a competition The team managed to win the quarter-finals and **go through to** the semi-finals.

1.40 frankly (adv)

ειλικρινά

[used at the beginning of a statement to show that the writer/speaker is giving his/her honest opinion]

I know that everyone likes that movie but, frankly, I think it's terrible.

frank (adj)

1.41 miss [2] (v)

αγνοείται

to not have someone/something that is necessary for something to work My laptop **is missing** the 'w' key, so I can only write 'here' instead of 'where'.

1.42 coach (n)

προπονητής

a person who trains a sports team or an athlete Our basketball **coach**, Mr. Peters, gives advice to each member of the team about how he can improve his game. • coach (v)

1.43 guess: it's anyone's guess (phr) εικασία

it is impossible to know for sure This story is so mysterious that **it's anyone's guess** what will happen at the end.

1.44 out of something: be out of something (phr v) $\xi \epsilon \mu \epsilon \nu \omega$

to not have any more of something, usually because all the rest is/are being used or has/ have been used

I'm afraid we **are** already **out of** chairs, so some of you will have to remain standing.

1.45 handout (n)

φυλλάδιο

a paper containing information that is given to a group of people (e.g. students)
The teacher gave the students a handout with all the information they needed for their project.
hand out something (to someone) (phr v)

1.46 end up (something / doing something) (phr v) καταλήγω

to finally be or do something, usually something unpleasant that you did not expect My friends hadn't brought any money with them, so I **ended up** having to pay for everyone's tickets.

1.47 fortune: spend a fortune (on something) (phr) ξοδεύω μια περιουσία

to spend a huge amount of money on something extremely expensive

Max **has spent a fortune on** his vintage comic book collection, which is worth twenty thousand dollars.

1.48 stall (n)

πάγκος πωλητή

a small area where something is sold There is a small **stall** on the street outside the stadium, where you can buy hot dogs and burgers.

1.49 otherwise (adv)

Αλλιώς, διαφορετικά

[used to show that the writer/speaker is talking about what could happen if something else does not happen] *You should wear a warm jacket, otherwise you're going to get cold.*

1.50 broke (adj)

άφραγκος

having no money I'm so **broke** I don't even have the money to pay for a bus ticket.

1.51 Tell me about it! (phr)

εμένα μου λες

[used to show that the writer/speaker strongly agrees with what someone else has said, e.g. because he/she has experienced the same thing]

"I hate Mrs. Lowell's math class. It's so difficult!" "**Tell me about it!** I can hardly understand anything."

1.52 supposed: be supposed to do something (v)[1]

υποτίθεται

to be expected to do something, often something that you do not do as expected Jack **was supposed to** call me at ten in the morning, but I didn't hear from him until three in the afternoon.

1.53 instead (of something / doing something) (adv)

αντ'αυτού, αντί να

rather than something else

Why don't you go out and get some fresh air, **instead of** sitting in front of the screen all day?

1.54 coast (n)

ακτή

the area where the sea meets the land
It was such a nice day that we decided to drive
along the coast and have a picnic by the sea.
coastal (adj)

Listening Part 2, Items 11-20, p. 24

1.55 survey (n)

ερωτηματολόγιο

a group of questions to get information about people's opinions or experiences on a topic, e.g. for research

The researchers asked five hundred people, aged between eighteen and thirty, to answer an online **survey**, in order to get information about people's daily routines. • survey (v)

1.56 regarding (prep)

σχετικά με

on the topic of *I have some advice for you regarding next week's exam.* • regard (v)

1.57 form (n)

μορφή

the way in which a thing exists or appears In the book, we see that the wizard takes the form of a lion.

1.58 purchase (v)

αγοράζω to buy something You can **purchase** products cheaper during the winter sales.

• purchase (n)

1.59 vinyl (n)

βινύλιο a synthetic plastic used for making music records Back in the 1960s, people used to buy music on **vinyl** records.

1.60 cassette (n)

κασέτα

a small plastic case, which contains magnetic tape that lets you listen to and record music, speech or sound

Then, in the 1980s, people started buying music on **cassettes**, which were cheaper and easier to carry and store.

1.61 find out (something / about something) (phr v) ανακαλύπτω

to get more information about something (e.g. a subject)

I'm interested in tropical plants and would like to **find out** more information on the subject.

1.62 terms: in terms of

αναφορικά με

[used to show which specific part of someone/ something you are referring to] The two songs have very different musical

styles, but they are similar **in terms of** the words.

1.63 move (v)

μετακομίζω

to change the place that you live in I used to live in London, but I **moved** to New York last year. • move (n)

1.64 put down (phr v) σημειώνω

to write or mark something, usually a piece of information and with a pen or a pencil We may need to call you on your cell phone or your home phone, so please **put down** both numbers on the form.

1.65 concern (v)

αφορά

to relate to a certain topic *If your question* **concerns** *the exam, you should ask your teacher, as I don't know much on that topic.* • concerning (adj)

1.66 fan (n)

λάτρης, οπαδός

a person who likes and takes great interest in something (e.g. a sports team) All the **fans** went crazy when their team scored in the final minute.

1.67 rarely (adv)

σπάνια

not often

I used to see Will all the time, but now we only meet **rarely**. • rare (adj), rarity (n)

1.68 to be honest (phr)

για να είμαι ειλικρινής [used to show that the writer/speaker is saying something that might seem surprising, shocking, insulting, unusual, etc.] Jason is a good guitar player but, **to be honest**, I think his songs are a bit boring.

1.69 liking: for my liking (phr)

για τα γούστα μου compared to what I normally like *This chocolate is a bit too sweet* **for my liking**.

1.70 peace and quiet (phr)

να βρω την ηρεμία μου freedom from noise, trouble, anxiety, etc. *I can't wait to get out of this noisy and crowded mall and find some* **peace and quiet** *back home.*

1.71 pick (v)

διαλέγω

to choose something from a number of options *picked* my favorite song from the list an clicked play.
pick (n), picky (adj)

1.72 spot (n)

σημείο

a specific place that is used or is suitable for something

If you want to relax and enjoy nature, this quiet bench next to the river is the perfect **spot**.

1.73 actually (adv)

Βασικά

[used to show that the writer/speaker is saying something that the other person may not know or expect and therefore may find surprising, unusual, etc.]

"Has anyone ever told you that you and Steven look very alike?" "**Actually**, we're brothers." "Really? I didn't know that."

1.74 format (n)

μορφή

the way a sound recording is made available I prefer it if a song track is in mp3 format because I can save it on my computer.

1.75 definitely (not) (adv)

αναμφίβολα (όχι) / σίγουρα (όχι)

[used to show that the writer/speaker is 100% sure about something] "Do you think we can trust Isabelle?" "Definitely. She always tells the truth."

1.76 loads (of something) (n)

πολύ

a lot of

He's extremely busy and has **loads of** work to do.

1.77 convenient (adj) βολικό

easy and not likely to cause problems for someone

There is so much traffic on the roads that it is easier and more **convenient** to go on foot. • convenience (n), inconvenient (adj), inconvenience (n)

1.78 booklet (n)

έντυπο

a small book, with a paper cover, that gives information

The toy comes with a three-page **booklet** that explains how to put the pieces together.

1.79 occasionally (adv) περιστασιακά

not often, every now and then They don't often have the chance to leave the city, although they **occasionally** go to their summer house when they have time. • occasional (adj)

1.80 review (n)

κριτική / αξιολόγηση

a written article or a video in which someone gives his/her opinion about something (e.g. a new movie) and how good or bad it is *The review said that the food is excellent and gave the restaurant five stars.* • reviewer (n)

1.81 critic (n)

κριτικός

a person who writes or speaks about how good or bad something is (e.g. a work of art) The **critic** felt that, in his professional opinion, the movie lacked a full development of the characters.

• critique (v), critique (n)

1.82 critical (adj)

επικριτικός

expressing a negative opinion of something The engineer was very **critical** about the design, calling it 'completely terrible'. • criticism (n)

1.83 done: be (almost) done (phr)

τελειώσαμε

to have (almost) finished something that you are/were doing We just have one more exercise to finish then we'**re done** and can go home.

1.84 hardly ever (adv)

σχεδόν ποτέ almost never Ever since Jane became a nurse, she is always at work and we **hardly ever** see her socially.

1.85 sell out (phr v)

ξεπουλάω

(e.g. tickets) to be all sold, so that there are none left

The new book was so popular that the first 50,000 copies **sold out** after only one day, and customers had to wait for the bookstores to get new copies.

1.86 that's too bad (phr)

κακώς

[used to show that the writer/speaker sympathizes about something unfortunate] *"Jane and I don't speak to each other anymore." "That's too bad.* You used to be such good friends."

1.87 act (n)

συγκρότημα

a musician or group of musicians We saw four bands play at the rock concert. My favorite **act** was The Resonators, who played old-style rock n' roll.

1.88 overall (adj)

εν γένει

general, including all the people or things in a certain category Apart from his messy hair, his **overall** appearance - his clothes, his shoes, his glasses - is smart.

Listening Part 3, Items 21-25, p. 25

1.89 hold (v)

διεξάγω

to have an event (a party, a meeting, a competition, etc.) that involves a number of people

The students **are holding** a meeting next week, and everyone should go.

1.90 drawback (n)

μειονέκτημα

a disadvantage or problem of something that also has advantages

The only **drawback** of the electric car is that on longer journeys you need to stop and charge it often, so the journey takes even longer.

1.91 headphones (n) ακουστικά

a piece of electrical equipment with two parts that are worn over or inside the ears, for listening to something recorded (e.g. music) When my parents are home and I want to listen to music in my bedroom, I put my **headphones** on, so that they won't complain about the noise.

1.92 outdated (adj)

απαρχαιωμένος

no longer used or produced CDs are now considered **outdated**, as these days most people use the Internet to listen to music.

1.93 stereo speakers (n)

ηχεία

a kind of electrical equipment that plays sound (e.g. music) in a way that seems to come from various directions and seems realistic to the listener

The sound from these new **stereo speakers** is so realistic that it feels as if you are in the movie.

1.94 ideal (adj)

ιδανικός

perfectly suitable for someone/something This science book is **ideal** for younger students because it explains everything in a simple way that children can understand.

1.95 point: that is the point (phr) Αυτή είναι η ουσία

that is the purpose/aim of something These horror movies aim to make people feel scared. **That is the point**. If you don't feel frightened, the movie hasn't done its job!

1.96 set (of something) (n)

σετ

a group of things that go together and are the same in some way (e.g. they are used for the same purpose)

I went to the arts store to buy a **set** of twentyfour colored pencils.

1.97 shout (v)

φωνάζω

to say something or make a noise with your voice loudly

My friend was standing at the other end of the street, so I had to **shout** as loud as I could.

shout (n)

1.98 break: take a break (from something / doing something) (phr)

διάλειμμα

to stop doing something so that you can rest I think we should **take a break from** watching this series. We've already watched six episodes, and my eyes are beginning to hurt. • break (from something / from doing something) (v)

1.99 concerned: as far as [I am] concerned (phr) όσο με αφορά

in [my] opinion, for [me]

The boss says we should look smart at the office. **As far as he's concerned**, sneakers and jeans just give the wrong image.

1.100 benefit (n)

όφελος, πλεονέκτημα an advantage One of the many **benefits** of exercising during

the day is that it helps you sleep better at night.
beneficial (adj), benefit someone/something
(v), benefit (from something) (v)

1.101 dull (adj) [2]

βαρετός

boring

The movie was so **dull** I lost interest after only twenty minutes.

1.102 crowd (n)

πλήθος

a large group of people standing or sitting together

A **crowd** of 3,000 people stood in front of the stage, waiting for the singer to come out.

1.103 separate (adj)

ξεχωριστό

on its own and not joined to something else While taking the test, each of the students must sit at a **separate** table, because it is easier for them to copy each other's work if they are sitting two or three together at the same table.

1.104 compartment (n) βαγόνι

one part of a railway or metro train We were sitting in the **compartment** at the back of the train.

1.105 point: that is my point (phr)

αυτό ακριβώς λέω και εγώ

that is the opinion that I am expressing "We'd have a better chance of winning the tournament if our players improved their physical fitness, instead of concentrating on technique all the time." "That's a good point. They need more than just ball skills to win games." "**That's** exactly **my point**."

1.106 no matter how/who/where, etc. (conj) ανεξάρτητα από

[used to say that something has no effect on a situation]

No matter what time of year it is, the price for hotel rooms doesn't change.

1.107 harmful (to something) (adj)

βλαπτικός

able to cause damage to someone or something, e.g. someone's health or the natural environment

Dogs should never eat onions, as this is one of the types of food that are **harmful to** dogs and can make them sick.

• harm (n), harm (v), harmless (adj)

1.108 turn up (phr v)

δυναμώνω, ανεβάζω την ένταση

to move a control on a device to make it louder, brighter, faster, etc.

The video is too quiet. Can you **turn up** the sound and make it louder, so I can hear what the actors are saying?

1.109 bother (v)

ενοχλώ

to annoy or upset someone

I can't phone Rea after 11 pm. She's probably sleeping, and I don't want to **bother** her and make her angry.

• bother (n), bothersome (adj)

1.110 replace (v) [2]

αντικαθιστώ

to take the place of something else, e.g. something that is not as good or no longer available

The band are not happy with their singer and want to find someone new to **replace** him. • replacement (n)

1.111 suitable (adj)

κατάλληλος

with everything that is needed for a particular person, purpose, or situation *My apartment is too noisy, but at least the library is a suitable place to study, as it is quiet and there are always plenty of free tables.* • suit (v)

1.112 dog trainer (n)

εκπαιδευτής/εκπαιδεύτρια σκύλων
Our dog trainer, Sally, taught our dog to stop biting furniture.
• dog training (n)

1.113 vet (n)

κτηνίατρος

Our dog hasn't eaten her food for three days. I think we should take her to the **vet**, to see if she's ill.

• veterinarian (n), veterinary (adj)

1.114 observe (v)

παρατηρώ

While studying the Andromeda galaxy, astronomers **observed** a change in the position of several stars.observation (n)

1.115 calm down (phr v)

ηρεμώ

I asked the kids to **calm down** but they kept running around and making noise. • calm (adj), calm (n)

1.116 conclusion (n)

συμπέρασμα

a decision or idea based on looking at all the evidence

After looking carefully at all the evidence, their **conclusion** was shocking: these were not stars but planets.

• conclude (v)

1.117 anxiety (n)

άγχος

an illness in which someone always feels worried or scared, often without a real reason and in a way that has a bad effect on his/her life

Doctors say that **anxiety** is a common illness in modern society, with thousands of people reporting feeling worried every day. • anxious (adj)

1.118 medication (n)

φαρμακευτική αγωγή

a drug used for medical treatment The newly discovered **medication** can be taken in the form of a syrup and it helps to stop stomach pain.

• medicate (v)

1.119 beat (n)

Ρυθμός/ ανεβάζω ένταση

a strong sound that you can hear regularly in a piece of music, often made by a drum, marking the time that all the musicians follow when plaving

Before the song starts, the drummer hits the fast **beat**: one...two...three...four...

παραγωγός

someone who records something (e.g. music) in a studio

The band have asked a famous **producer** to help them record their new album in the studio. • produce (v), production (n)

1.121 energetic (adj)

ενεργητικός

showing great activityOur gym teacher is very **energetic**, and she really gets you moving.energy (n), energize (v)

1.122 curious (adj)

περίεργος

strange and unusual
Her eyes had a curious color that I had never
seen before, something between blue and green.
curiousness (n)

1.123 compose (v)

συνθέτω

to write a piece of music or poetry *It took the musician years to compose this symphony.*composer (n), composition (n)

1.124 instrument (n)

μουσικό όργανο

an object used for making musical sounds, e.g. a piano, a guitar, drums, etc. Sam can play lots of **instruments**: the guitar, the violin, the piano, and the flute.

1.125 immediately (adv)

αμέσως

right away, with no delay If there is a fire, leave the building **immediately** and do not waste time collecting your things. • immediate (adj)

1.126 relax (v)

χαλαρώνω

to make or become less nervous or angry *I know you're nervous, but try to relax by taking deep breaths.* • relaxation (n), relaxed (adj)

1.127 bark (v)

γαβγίζω

(dogs) to 'shout' loudly
The dogs bark loudly when anyone they don't know passes outside the garden.
bark (n)

1.128 search: in search of something (phr)

σε αναζήτηση

Many people come to the amusement park **in search of** fun and entertainment. • search (for something) (v), search (n)

1.129 respond (to something) (v)

ανταποκρίνομαι

to be affected by someone or something, so that you do something as a result *Many people responded to the street musicians by stopping to watch and clapping their hands, and some even started dancing.* • response (to something) (n), responsive (to something) (adj)

1.130 come across (phr v)

βρίσκω, ανακαλύπτω, συναντώ to find something, often by luck *I was scrolling, looking for anything interesting, when I came across an article about my school.*

1.131 alternative (to something) (n) εναλλακτική (λύση)

two or more available possibilities If you don't drink cow's milk, almond milk is an excellent **alternative**. • alternatively (adv)

1.132 lay down (on something) (phr v) ξαπλώνω

to put your body on something (e.g. a bed) in a horizontal position

The couch is big enough to **lay down on** and go to sleep.

1.133 researcher (n)

ερευνητής

a person who does academic or scientific study While working at the university as a **researcher** in chemistry, she made a discovery that would change the world. • research (v), research (n)

1.134 suffer from something (phr v)
